## ORDER:

The Department of Economic Affairs, Government of India has invited project proposal for Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Overseas Development Assistance loan(ODA) for the financial year 2014 to improve the Urban Health A detailed Draft Project Report for Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project with the following five major components was proposed for loan under Japanese International Cooperation Agency(JICA):-

- Upgrading of three Tertiary Hospitals (Facilities and Medical Equipment)
- Strengthening of fourteen Referral Hospitals (Medical Equipment) (i)
- Strengthening of four secondary care hospitals (Facilities and Medical (ii) (iii) Equipment)
- Strengthening Hospital Management (21 facilities)
- Strengthening Primary Health Care in Non-Communicable Diseases (2 (iv)(v)Regional facilities)

2. In this connection, the Department of Economic Affairs, Finance, Government of India had arranged a meeting for discussion for Overseas Development Assistance(ODA) Loan and process finalization. After a detailed discussion, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India has accepted the Detailed Project Report (DPR) and Minutes of Discussion(MOD) has been signed by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Tamil Nadu and JICA, India. The Japan International Co-operation

agency placed the Project in their Board Meeting at Tokyo on 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2016 following which the Government of Japan has issued a pledge. Exchange of Notes (E/N) and loan agreement between Government of India and Government of Japan has been signed on 31.3.2016.

3. The JICA will provide 85% of loan amounting to Rs.1387.87 crore (JPY 25,537 million). The State Government will provide 15% of the above project cost i.e Rs.255.82 crore (JPY 4,523 million). The total project cost is Rs.1633.695 crore (JPY 30,060 million). The base year for cost estimation is 2015. The project period is for seven years 2016-2022. The interest rate is 0.30% with 40 years term with 10 years grace period for loan repayment period for the above project.

4. In the Government Order second read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health system Project has been placed to look after the activities relating to Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project. The Project Director i/c, Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project has sent proposal towards Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project with five major component for loan under Japan International Co-operation agency (JICA) at a cost of Rs.1633.695 crore and requested to issue administrative sanction.

5. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Project Director i/c, Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project, issue the following orders:

- (a) Sanction is accorded for the implementation of Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project at a total cost of Rs.1634,69,50,000/- with the assistance of Japan International Co-operation agency (JICA) as detailed in the Annexure to this order.
- (b) to create one new post of Project Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project in the cadre of I.A.S. for implementation of the Japan International Cooperation agency (JICA) project.
- (c) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project is permitted to establish Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Society to implement the Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project with Project Management Unit broadly on similar lines as Tamil Nadu Health System Project.
- (d) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project is permitted to carry out the Tamil Nadu Urban Health Care Project in Tamil Nadu in 21 Urban Towns /Cities in 17 Districts of the State viz., Madurai, Chennai, Coimbatore, Salem, Vellore, Thanjavur, Tirunelveli, Trichirappalli, Thoothukkudi, Kanniyakumari, Erode, Tiruppur, Cuddalore, Dindigul, Pudukkottai, Krishnagiri and Periyakulam as detailed below:-
